General and Technical Regulation of the Championship

The 2nd World University Weightlifting Championship organized by the International University Sports Federation (FISU) will take place from July 1st to 5th, 2010 in Taichung, Chinese Taipei. This championship is supervised by the Sports Affairs Council and the Chinese Taipei University Sports Federation (CTUSF) is the organizing committee with the assistance of Taichung City Government, Chinese Taipei Weightlifting Association and Weightlifting Committee of CTUSF.

1. Competition Venue and provisional programme:

This championship will take place in the National Taiwan College of Physical Education, Taichung city, Chinese Taipei and the general programme is as following:

- June 29: Arrival
- June 30: Verification of Final Entries; Technial Meeting,
- July 1: Opening Ceremony; Competitions
- July 2-4: Competitions
- July 5: Competitions; Closing Ceremony

2. International Supervision, Control, and Arbitration Committee (CISCA)

Set up by the Executive Committee of FISU, the CISCA will have final decision during the Championship on all questions of policy or dispute. The Committee is composed of:

- a. Chairman: Mr. Bayasgalan Danzandorj, a member of Executive Committee of FISU;
- b. a member of the FISU CIC: Mr. Kenji Nishimura
- c. the Chair of Technical Committee of FISU: Mrs. Anikó Németh-Móra
- d. the delegate of International Weightlifting Federation: Mr. Attila Adamfi
- e. a member of Medical Commission of FISU: Dr. Pietro Rettagliata
- f. the delegate of the Chinese Taipei University Sports Federation:
- g. the representative of the Organizing Committee:

3. Technical Committee:

The Technical Committee shall be made up of :

- a. the Chair: Mrs. Anikó Németh-Móra
- b. the Delegate of International Weightlifting Federation: Mr. Attila Adamfi
- c. Technical Representative of the Organizing Committee:
- d. 3 experts nominated by CISCA from among participating delegations:

The Committee, following the decisions of CISCA, will carry out such tasks as technical rules for competition, checking of equipment and facilities, assignment of referees, scheduling of competitions, etc.

4. Technical Rules:

The Championship will be run in accordance with the recently updated IWF rules and related rules stipulated by FISU.

5. Bodyweight Categories:

Men: 56kg, 62kg, 69kg, 77kg, 85kg, 94kg, 105kg, +105kg
Women: 48kg, 53kg, 58kg, 63kg, 69kg, 75kg, +75kg

6. Sequence of competition:

- a. the Snatch
- b. the Clean and jerk

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded in Snatch, Clean and Jerk and Total.

7. Number of Participants

Each country is authorized to enter a maximum of twenty (20) persons from which eight (8) men competitors and seven (7) women competitors spread over the different categories with a maximum of two (2) competitors per category, and 5 officials.

8. Participation and Weigh-in

During the competition, competitor may not compete in more than one category.

For athletes, the official weigh-in is obligatory and begins two (2) hours before the start of the competition and lasts one hour.

9. Eligibility:

Only the competitors who satisfy the following conditions may take part in a FISU sporting event:

- a. Be a citizen of the nation (region) he/she represents.
- b. Be at least 17 and younger than 28 years of age on January 1st of 2010. (born between January 1, 1982 and December 31, 1992)
- c. Be a student who is currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at a university or similar institute whose status is recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of his/her country (region).
- d. Be a former student of an institution mentioned in (c) who has obtained the academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the event.

10. Doping Control:

Doping control will be conducted before, during or after the competition, with all participating competitors subject to drug testing in compliance with the regulations laid down by the International Weightlifting Federation (IWF), the International University Sports Federation (FISU), and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

11. Confirmation of Accredited Competitors

At the first General Technical Meeting, the head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors accredited by the CISCA.

12. Technical Officials

The FISU TC Chair and the IWF Delegate will select a suitable number of Technical Officials (International Category 1 referees) from those proposed by the participating nations.

13. Prizes:

a. Individual Prizes:

Gold, silver and bronze medals together with diplomas are awarded respectively to the top three places for Snatch, the Clean and Jerk and the Total in each of the bodyweight categories.

b. Each participant will receive a diploma for participation.

14. Deadlines for Entries:

General Entry (intention of participate): January 1, 2010

Quantitative Entry (number of participants): March 1, 2010

Payment of Deposit (25%): March 1, 2010

Nominative Entry (names of participants): June 1, 2010

All entry forms may be sent by any electronic ways of communication or telefax to the organizing committee in order to meet the required entry deadlines, but they must be confirmed as soon as possible in writing on the official forms.

15. Financial Conditions

a. FISU Registration Fee:

- effective member-associations of FISU: 20 Euros per competitor and official;
- other association: 40 Euros per competitor and official

FISU registration fees will be collected by the Cisca before the issue of the competitors' identity cards.

b. Participation Fee:

60 Euros per person per day paid to the Organizing Committee by each participating country. The fee covers the costs of accommodations, meals, local transportation, social activities, etc.

16. Deposit:

All participating countries are requested to pay to the following bank a prepayment of 25% of participation fees for each athlete and official by March 1, 2010, simultaneously with forwarding the Quantitative Entry Forms, and upon their arrival, pay to the Organizing Committee the remaining balance:

17. Accommodations and Transportation:

During the Championship, the Organizing Committee will be responsible for the accommodation, meals and local transportation for the participating

countries. However, all domestic and international long distance telephone calls and fax, beverage in mini bar, and pay-services in the village or hotels shall be at the expense of users.

Plaza International Hotel will be the designated hotel of this championship for athletes, officials, referees and FISU delegates/VIPs. For more details of the above hotels, please go the websites as following:

As to the transportation, the organizing committee will take care of the local transportation between Taoyuan International Airport (TPE) and the hotel. During the competition, shuttle bus service will be available between Hotels and the competition venue. 18. Medical Service:

The Organizing Committee will provide sufficient medical service for the Championship. Nearby Hospitals are committed to provide immediate treatment for the Championship.

19. Security:

The Organizing Committee will do its utmost to guarantee the safety of all participants.

20. Visa:

Most countries around the world are eligible for visa-exempt entry to Taiwan; however, if there is any query as to visa, you may approach our representative office in your country, which will provide you with as much information and assistance as possible in this regard.

21. International travel costs:

Participating country shall be responsible for its delegation's international travel costs to and from Taipei.

20. Delegation's flag:

For the purpose of opening/closing and victory ceremonies, the participating delegations are requested to bring with them 4 national/regional flags (96 x 144cm) as duly registered with FISU.

21. Some practical tidbits:

Climate: Taiwan's climate is subtropical, with average temperature of 25-30 degrees C in July.

Currency: Taiwan's unit of currency is the New Taiwan Dollar (NT\$). The exchange rate is around NT\$47 to EUROS 1 at a rough estimate in December of 2009.

Electricity and Water: Electric current used throughout Taiwan is 110 volt AC, 60 cycles. Drinking water served in the village and hotels is bottled or boiled.
